Course description

The Accredited SHE Representative course is aimed at individuals who are designated as safety, health, and environmental representatives within their organisations. It provides comprehensive training on their roles and responsibilities in promoting and ensuring workplace safety, health, and environmental compliance.

The SHE Representative appointment is a legal requirement under Section 17 of the Occupational Health and Safety Act and is compulsory for every organisation with more than 20 employees.

Course outcome

Students will be able to:

- Identify and explain the legal and workplace operational framework for the health, safety and environmental protection representative.
- Identify and explain the role and responsibilities of a safety, health and environmental protection representative.
- Identify other role players for safety, health and environmental protection representative and their roles.
- Explain the consequences of non-compliance in respect of safety, health and environmental protection and the representative's role.
